


THE GENESIS OF A COUNTRY IN THE LATE MIDDLE AGES



Colloquium Lazarensis in the Abbey of Kappel, 15th September 2012 Kappel

The third Colloquium Lazarensis with the topic "Glarus between Habsburg and Zürich - The Genesis of a Country in the Late Middle Ages" traditionally took place in the carefully renovated and redesigned Cistercian Abbey of Kappel am Albis. This gorgeous ambiance offered the perfect frame for the exceedingly stimulant lecture.

The following speech was held by the historian Dr. phil. Rolf Kamm.



Dr. Kamm studied History, German philology and history of art in Zurich. Today he works as historian, researcher and teacher in Glarus. He recently wrote the Book "Glarus between Habsburg and Zürich - The Genesis of a Country in the Late Middle Ages".

In his entertaining, transparent and ingenious lecture with the same title Dr. Kamm gave to his attentive audience not only an understanding of a valley but also a piece of Swiss history of the Late Middle Ages.

Inspired by this "intellectual feeding" the guests moved to the sunshiny autumnal, scenically gorgeous monastery garden, where animated and good-humoured conversations took place by a glass of sparkling wine.
